While Pastor Bob Bryant was in Eastern Europe on a mission trip, I was privileged to speak to the High School group on Saturday night at a progressive dinner, and to the congregation on Sunday morning.

The High Schoolers really asked me lots of tough questions. In addition to "normal" questions about the Bema, the Tribulation, the eternal state, and the like, they also asked unusual questions such as: "Do clones have souls?" and "If Jesus married and had children, would His children be sinners?" The latter question was, I think, influenced by the heretical book The DaVinci Code.

On Sunday I preached on 1 Chronicles 13 and 15, the incident about David moving the Ark. I entitled the message, "Don't Touch the Ark: Follow God's Directions." David picked what he thought was a very God-honoring way to transport the Ark to Jerusalem. Unfortunately, he didn't read the directions God had already given for doing so. Hence when Uzzah touched the Ark at one point in an attempt to keep it from toppling over, he immediately died. I showed that if God has told us how to do something, then the way in which we do that thing, and not just the end


