We discussed passages such as the rich young ruler, the woman at the well, and the warning passages in Hebrews. All the sessions were made available in Spanish and were well received. It was well attended, with over 120 people on Friday and Saturday. In addition, Ken had the opportunity to speak at their worship service on Saturday night.

This conference also was the first time we had Ken's book Elisabeth: Christ's Medal of Honor Recipient available in Spanish. We sold every copy we brought of it and of Zane Hodges's book The Gospel Under Siege in Spanish. It was an amazing weekend, with wonderful teaching and sweet fellowship. This semester was the first full semester for our new online seminary. Classes ended just before Thanksgiving. Student feedback was excellent. See comments under Notes and Letters.

The classes (along with the professor and number of students in each class) were as follows: Soteriology (Wilkin, 10), Introduction to Pastoral Ministry (Elkins, 6), Old Testament Survey 1 (Sterling, 7), Logos Bible Software for Exegesis (Fiess, 9), Theology Proper, Pneumatology, and Christology (Elkins, 9), and New Testament Greek 1 (Badger and Yates, 15).

Our spring classes include NT Survey (Sterling), OT Survey 2 (Sterling), Bibliology and Ecclesiology (Wilkin), Logos for Exegesis (Fiess), Greek 102 (Badger and Yates), and Tough Texts (Vacendak). See faithalone.org for registration information.
